

BLETCHLEY PARK

Bletchley Park was an English country house built in 1883 for Sir Herbert Leon, and it became during the second world war the home to the top secret codebreakers, and is now an interesting heritage attraction. There are many interactive displays, and recreated rooms of the WW2 which take you back to past times. The people at Bletchley Park created the automatic machinery to help with decryption which ended in the development of Colossus, the world's first programmable digital electronic computer. The house is set in lovely grounds and offers refreshments from the on site cafes.
