GILBERT WHITE HOUSE & GARDENS, SELBOURNE

Gilbert White was an 18th century naturalist pioneer born on the 18 July 1720, and he lived in this stately 17th century house set in 25 acres of beautiful gardens in Selbourne on the corner of the South Downs National Park. The house is fascinating and is home to many different treasures and artefacts one in particular White's rare 18th century floral embroidered bed covers. The museum also has collections which belonged to Lawrence Oates who was part of the fateful Terra Nova expedition to the South Pole. The extended 19th century gardens are wonderful to explore and there are the cottage and herb kitchen gardens to wander through and the wildflower meadow and rolling grasslands. Refreshments can be found in the cosy café and there is the farm shop selling organic produce and honey and jam. There is also the 1765 brewhouse selling their Gilbert's Craft beer and the gift shop has many naturally inspired gifts.
