Bletchley Park is an English country house built for Sir Herbert Leon in 1883 and set in lovely grounds. During the second world war it became the home of top-secret codebreakers such as Alan Turing the enigma code breaker. Bletchley Park created much of the automatic machinery which led to the development of Colossus the world's first programmable digital electronic computer. It is a fascinating place with many interactive displays and rooms recreating the atmosphere of War World 11. Refreshments can be bought from the onsite cafes and during our coach journey there will be a 15-minute comfort break.
