Crossness Pumping Station is located on the south shore of the River Thames a few miles from London Bridge. It is a former sewage pumping station which was designed by the Metropolitan Board of Works's chief engineer Sir Joseph Bazalgette. It was constructed between 1859 and 1865 by William Webster and features spectacular ornamental cast ironwork and is described as a masterpiece of engineering and referred to as a Victorian cathedral of ironwork and it must be seen to be believe as to how beautiful it is.
