

BATEMANS, SUSSEX - HOME OF RUDYARD KIPLING

Itinerary

Batemans was built in 1634 and is set n 300 acres of wooded landscape in the Sussex Weald. It was the home of Rudyard Kipling, and the 17th century house remains much the same as it was when he lived there. With its beautiful oak beams and mullion windows and many interesting artifacts. The gardens are extensive and are a delight to walk through. A stop at the Mulberry garden tea room, which has indoor and outdoor seating is a must serving hot and cold drinks, light lunches and homemade cakes. There is the 18th century working watermill which was much loved by Kipling and features in his many stories. The Oast House shop has gifts and Kipling's books are for sale and there is also the second handbook shop for book lovers to browse and explore.
