

BATEMANS, SUSSEX – HOME OF RUDYARD KIPLING

Itinerary

Batemans was built in 1634 and is set in 300 acres of wooded landscape in the Sussex Weald. It was the home of Rudyard Kipling, and the 17th century house remains much the same as it was when he lived there, with its beautiful oak beams and mullion windows, and many interesting artifacts. The gardens are extensive and are a delight to walk through and a stop at the Mulberry Garden tearoom which serves hot and cold drinks, light lunches and homemade cakes, which has indoor and outdoor seating is a must. There is the 18th century working watermill which was much loved by Kipling and features in his stories. The Oast House shop has many gifts and Kipling books for sale and there is the second handbook shop for book lovers to browse and explore.
